




We have reopened our reception area for appointments. Clients should call 830-257-4144 upon arrival and check in with our receptionist. When it is time for you to enter our facility with your pet, a face mask is required. Our receptionist will call you when it is time for you to enter the building. We are pleased to return to normal operations and are looking forward to serving you. If you prefer curbside service, please let our receptionist know when you check in. We appreciate your patience and understanding.

□□The shelter is beginning to open but current guidelines are still in place for our adoption process.

How to adopt in 5 easy steps:

- 1. Click on adopt button to find the dog or cat you are interested in adopting.
- 2. Request an application by emailing us from that animal's photo and biography.
- 3. Fill out the application (we will contact you when it has been reviewed).
- 4. Meet your choice outside at the shelter to see if you are a good fit.
- 5. Fill out the final paperwork and pay the adoption fee.

Surgery Reminders!

 \succ If you are unable to keep your surgery appointment, please call to cancel as soon as possible. This will give us an opportunity to schedule another client.

- > NO FOOD after your pet's evening meal, preferably no later than 6 p.m. Water is acceptable.
- > Please have your pet on a leash or in a carrier!
